Academics uses student self-report of grades earned in school to estimate academic achievement. Students with high grades are those who report getting mostly As and mostly Bs; students with low grades are those who report getting mostly Ds and mostly Fs.

Race/ethnicity was assessed through use of two questions directly taken from the Youth Risk Behavior Survey developed by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Students can select more than one race option. For this summary, students were classified as American Indian, Asian, Black (non-Hispanic), or White (non-Hispanic) if they only selected the respective group. Students were classified as Hispanic/Latino if they answered yes to, "Are you Hispanic or Latino?" Dissaggregation of the race/ethnicity categories for those who indicated, "Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander" and Multiple Race (includes students who selected more than one race category and answered no to, "Are you Hispanic or Latino?") has been suppressed.
